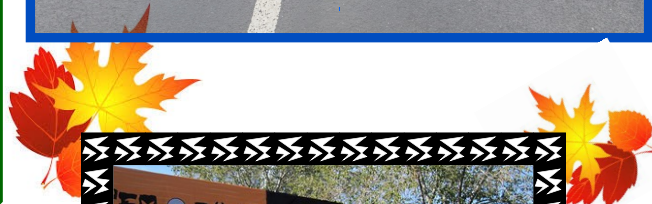

Village Of Winnebago President's Message



We have seen in the news about how our energy costs have gone up, whether it be for gasoline, natural gas, or electricity. Residents and small businesses in the Village of Winnebago have benefited for many years now from Aggregation of Electricity agreements that allow us to negotiate with various electricity suppliers for the best rates available. Two years ago, the Village entered into an Aggregation of Electricity agreement, along with several other smaller area municipalities, with Dynegy Energy Services. We were able to secure a low rate of 6.009 cents per Kilowatt Hour (KWh). That rate was locked in for a total of 24 months and ended with our Com Ed bill that was issued on August 30, 2022.

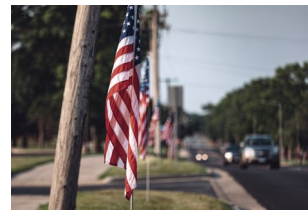
When we started looking at negotiating a new agreement in early June of 2022, Com Ed had its current rate of 11.041 cents per KWh for summer rates and non-summer rates were 9.122 cents per KWh. The initial rates we received from various electricity suppliers with a starting time of September of 2022 were very high. A single year agreement was anywhere from 11.20 cents per KWh to 12.590 cents per KWh. 2-year rates were anywhere from 9.49 cents to 10.77 cents. There was a 3-year rate of 8.425, but that same day that we were going to lock in with that rate, the energy provider said it could not guarantee it and would not let us lock in at that rate. As you are aware, the energy market fluctuates daily. It then became apparent that trying to lock in with a satisfactory rate commencing in September of 2022 was not feasible. We did see that energy suppliers were providing agreements to start in April of 2023 with lower rates at around 8.69 to 9.35 cents per KWh. We then received a better offer of 8.170 per KWh, if we waited until June 2023 to lock into the agreement for 3 years. We opted to take this agreement, believing that even though the current Com Ed rate would be a little higher, at least we would have the lowest rate possible in June of 2023 and have that guaranteed rate for 3 years. Fortunately, the actual Com Ed rate for the non-summer months actually fell below the stated rate of 9.122 cents per KWh and is currently 8.418 cents per KWh. Energy Harbor will be the electricity supplier for the village starting June 2023 and notices will be sent out around April 3, 2023, to all residents and small businesses. As with all previous agreements, if the regular Com Ed rate ever goes lower than our contract rate, the electricity supplier has the right to either match that lower rate or go lower than that rate, otherwise, we may opt out of the agreement and have Com Ed be our supplier of electricity. If you have questions or would like some additional information, we do have information regarding the aggregation of electricity on our village website under "Residents" and you will also find a link in that message to some questions and answers that was posted on August 1, 2022.

The Consolidated General Election for the Village of Winnebago, will be held on April 4, 2023, with the following offices of Village Trustee: two 2-year terms, three – 4-year terms.
