ORDINANCE NO. 98-6

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 1 OF ORDINANCE 97-9 ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING CERTAIN VEHICLES FROM PARKING ON PUBLIC STREETS, ALLEYS, AND PUBLIC RIGHT OF WAYS"

WHEREAS, the Village of Winnebago Board of Trustees believes it to be in the best interest of the Village of Winnebago to further clarify the provisions of Ordinance 97-9 in order to ensure a complete understanding by the citizenry of the content of the same and so as not to unduly burden such citizenry.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Winnebago, Illinois as follows:

Section 1 of "An Ordinance Prohibiting Certain Vehicles From Parking on Public Streets, Alleys, and Public Right of Ways" heretofore passed, approved, and published in pamphlet form on September 8, 1997, shall be and hereby is amended to read as follows:

SECTION 1: That it shall be unlawful for any truck, moving van, truck tractor, tractor trailer combination with a G.V.W. of 8001 lbs. or higher, (D registration plate), trailer, motor home, mini motor home, truck camper, or van camper, to be parked on any public street, alley, paved surface designed for public traffic, or on any public right of way not connected to property owned or leased by the motor vehicle operator, except for a public parking lot, within the Village, for a period of time greater than one (1) hour. However, this section shall not prohibit any of the above-mentioned vehicles to be so temporarily parked for a longer period of time, provided the time is reasonable, for the sole and exclusive purpose of loading and unloading such vehicle.

SECTION 2: All other provisions of Ordinance 97-9 not in conflict with the provisions herein shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 3: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage, approval, and publication, as provided by law.
